Restaurants in Minnesota are a driving force in the state's economy. Their sales generate tremendous tax revenues. They provide jobs and build careers for thousands of people. In 2012, Minnesota's restaurants are projected to register **\$7.9 billion** in sales.



Every \$1 spent in Minnesota's restaurants generates an additional **\$1.10** in sales for the state economy.



In 2010, there were **9,785** eating and drinking places in Minnesota.



Every extra \$1 million spent in Minnesota's restaurants generates an additional **29.3** jobs in the state.
