Restaurants in Missouri are a driving force in the state's economy. Their sales generate tremendous tax revenues. They provide jobs and build careers for thousands of people. In 2012, Missouri's restaurants are projected to register **\$8.8 billion** in sales.



Every \$1 spent in Missouri's restaurants generates an additional **\$1.10** in sales for the state economy.



In 2010, there were **10,622** eating and drinking places in Missouri.



Every extra \$1 million spent in Missouri's restaurants generates an additional **28** jobs in the state.

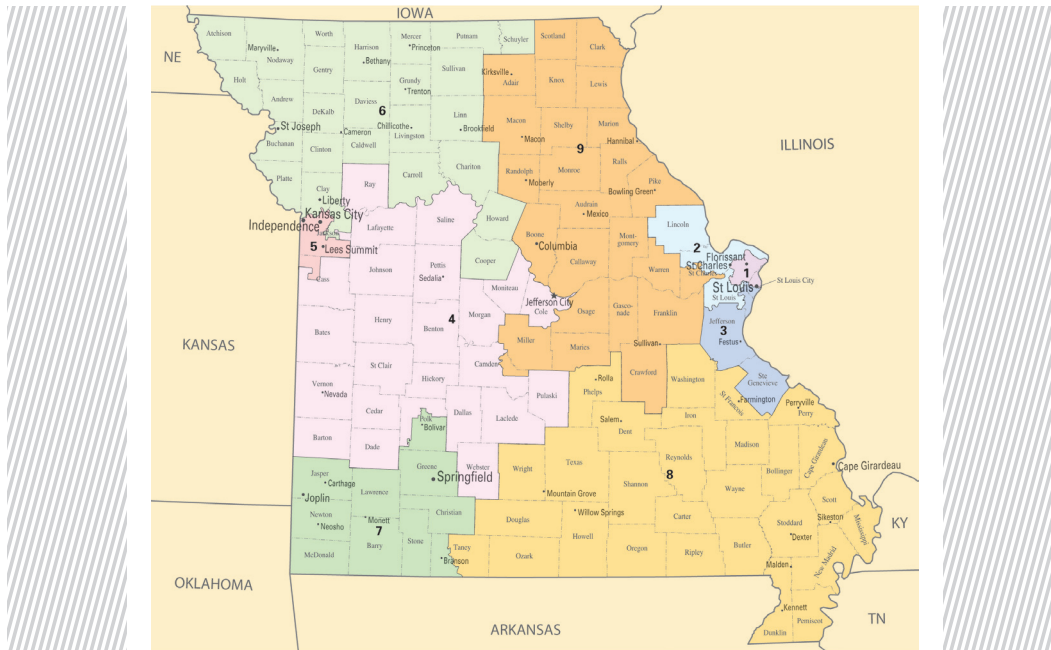
