Restaurants in Washington are a driving force in the state's economy. Their sales generate tremendous tax revenues. They provide jobs and build careers for thousands of people. In 2012, Washington's restaurants are projected to register **\$10.4 billion** in sales.



Every \$1 spent in Washington's restaurants generates an additional **\$1.02** in sales for the state economy.



In 2010, there were **13,836** eating and drinking places in Washington.



Every extra \$1 million spent in Washington's restaurants generates an additional **25.7** jobs in the state.
