## This is **bad for...**

**... employees.** When tipping their server, 67% of Chicago diners tip more than 15%, giving servers significantly more earning potential than a flat service fee. Every server is guaranteed \$15.80/hour.

**... customers.** 85% of Chicago diners say a bill that's 10% higher from increased menu prices or automatic service charges would negatively impact their dining experience.

**... restaurants.** A majority (53%) of Chicago diners would eat at home more often if restaurants were forced to increase prices by 15% to cover the proposal.

**... Chicago.** Increased menu prices or automatic service charges would lead 44% of Chicago diners to find restaurants outside the city.
