OF THE RESTAURANT & FOODSERVICE INDUSTRY



SUMMER 2025 In 2025, New Mexico's eating and drinking places are projected to contribute **\$9.34B** in direct economic output to the state's economy, support **88,924** jobs, and deliver **\$3.05B** in total labor income, including wages, salaries, and proprietors' income, and benefits.

These contributions spur additional spending in the U.S. economy. When including indirect and induced impacts from employees, suppliers, and others in the surrounding area, the industry's total economic impact rises to \$14.12B in output, supporting 111,189 jobs, and \$4.35B in total labor income.

The industry will also be a major source of public revenue. Direct contributions will total **\$1.33B in taxes** to all levels of government, including \$51.38M in county taxes, \$513.64M in state taxes and \$661.22M in federal taxes. With induced and indirect effects included, total contributions will reach **\$1.93B in taxes**, with \$73.68M in county taxes, \$739.81M in state taxes and \$971.2M in federal taxes.







